### **Consent Agenda:**

1. Minutes of November 8, 2005 were reviewed. Dan Ralphs moved to accept the minutes and Ralph Bennett seconded the motion. Vote was unanimous.
2. The Financial Report was reviewed. David Ross moved to accept the report and Don Cotant seconded the motion. Vote was unanimous.

### **Report Agenda:**

1. IHSAA Board of Control Report - Don Cotant- The State football scheduling for 4A and the 5A has not been completed. Schools in the north are having trouble getting enough games. Charter Schools are a concern and are asking to join the IHSAA. The 2A schools request to play 100 quarters was denied. The State is looking at assigning officials to the state tournaments based on the number of schools participating in that sport in each district. schools for. There will be one more reading of this. Coy Pratt will contact Districts 4 and 6 to make sure they are aware of this and join in the effort to defeat this move. Five Quarters of football per week from Sunday to Sunday was moved to the action agenda. The Parade of Athletes at State Volleyball is an issue as it is making some schools stay longer than necessary after they have been eliminated from the tournament. The Soccer Season might move to start one week earlier. This item will move to the Action Agenda. Candidates to be the Executive Secretary to the IHSAA and replace Bill Young are Bob Randall, Gerry Nutt, and John Billets.
2. Superintendents Report – Ted Taylor Superintendents from District 4/5/6 will meet January 12, 4/5/6 to discuss a variety of proposals that will affect activities.

### **Discussion Agenda**

1. Basketball Officials Rankings –Ballots are to be faxed to schools on January 18. Ralph Bennett will compile the ballots submitted by the officials and send the result to Irene Alder to be compiled with the coaches' ballots.
2. Coaches Sport Tests Gary Brogan moved to eliminate having coaches take the test in their sport. Lee Ralphs seconded the motion. Vote: Yes 6 No5 Motion carried.
3. Soccer Commissioner-Mark Robert the Soccer Commission has submitted his resignation. The position will be advertised.

### **Action Agenda**

1. Snake River High School Boys Basketball Ejections  
Motion – Snake River players ejected under IHSAA Rule 4-3-1 in the Shelly game shall be suspended for the remainder of the season. Vote: yes 3 no 5 / Abstain-Ron Echols Motion failed.

Motion -Players ejected under IHSA rule 4-3-1 in the Shelly game, shall be suspended for five consecutive varsity games beginning January 5, 2006. If those players ejected in any future contest in the 2005/2006 m basketball season under IHSA Rule 4-3-1, they will be suspended for the remainder of the basketball season. Vote: Yes 11 / No 1 / Abstain Ron Echols Motion carried.

Motion –Any future violations of IHSA Rule 4-3-1 by the Snake River High School Boys Basketball program during the remainder of the 2005/2006-basketball season will come under immediate review of the District Board of Control. Penalties will be assessed on the merits of each action.

Vote: Yes 11 Abstain-Ron Echols Motion carried.

2. Appeal Process- Dan Ralphs moved to assess a \$250 fee to convene an appeal board, payable when the board meets. Shari Bradley seconded the motion. Vote: Yes 10 No 2 Motion carried.

David Ross moved to have the appeal fee go into effect August 1, 2006. Tamara Christensen seconded the motion. Vote: Yes 10 No 2 Motion carried.

3.American Falls High School and Rockland High School’s application to renew their Baseball Cooperative. Gary Brogan moved and Ted Taylor seconded a motion to approve the application. Vote was unanimous.
